## **APPARTS**

One means of coming to grips with the real meaning of a primary source is to apply the APPARTS method. You should learn to do this every time you come into contact with a new document. Remember, just reading the words, does not mean that you understand the significance of the document itself. A few moments spent applying this tool will help you obtain a better understanding of the text in question.

- \* Author Who created the source? What is their point of view?
- \* Place and Time -Where and when was the source produced?
- \* **Prior Knowledge** What do you already know that would further your understanding of this sources?
- \* Audience For whom was the source created? Does this affect the reliability of the source?
- st Reason Why was this source produced at the time it was produced?
- \* The Main Idea What is the source trying to convey?
- \* Significance Why is this source important?
