Program tuition is \$45,000 for the complete two-year program. Students who are enrolled in the program are eligible for federal loans through The University of Texas at Austin Office of Student Financial Services. Eligible students in the master's program can receive Veterans Administration benefits through the Office of the Registrar at The University of Texas at Austin.
